Ethan Gach from Kotaku writes that while the gameplay is fun and does a good job of adapting the franchise for smartphones the current state of the rewards system bogs the game down; Nintendo has found massive success using the free-to-play with in-app purchases model with Fire Emblem Heroes reportedly generating close to \$500 million in revenue on its own, so the prospects of milking a premiere franchise like Mario Kart with the same model is an obvious move. Nothing we've seen or read so far is set in stone, as is the nature of beta that along with the stars, green gem, and coin currency systems, the game also includes a stamina system. using hearts that deplete every 15 minutes and can evidently be refilled with in-app purchases. Having only seen second-hand gameplay footage and first impressions from other game journalists, it honestly feels like Mario Kart Tour is shaping up to be a Dry Bones shell of what a Mario Kart game is supposed to be. These gameplay limitations feel especially weird given that this is the same franchise that let up to eight people wirelessly connect using just one cartridge with the Nintendo DS. Of course, I'm trying not to pass judgment on a game that's still in the early beta-testing phase. The game is expected to see a wide release sometime this summer, and hopefully by then we'll have a clearer look at the gameplay modes and mechanics — because if the core gameplay is fun and holds up to the series reputation, the nostalgia-factor alone might make Mario Kart Tour one of the biggest games of 2019. Mario Kart Tour, after a record-breaking first day, raked in 90 million unique downloads in its first week, making it by far Nintendo's biggest mobile launch. The mobile version of the massively popular Mario Kart series was downloaded 10.1 million times in its first day according to Apptopia, and more than 20 million times according to Sensor Tower's Store Intelligence. The figures were record-breaking, and it was expected that Mario Kart Tour's 90 million downloads in its first week are six times greater than Nintendo's second-best launch, which is Animal Crossing: Pocket Camp with 14.3 million downloads, according to Sensor Tower's Store Intelligence. In third place is Super Mario Run, with just below 13 million downloads in its first seven days, followed by Fire Emblem Heroes with 8.1 million downloads and Dr. Mario World with 3.6 million downloads. Android is the more popular platform for Mario Kart Tour, with 59.5% of downloads on Google's mobile operating system, while the United States is where the game was the most popular, with 14.7% of all downloads. In terms of spending, however, Mario Kart Tour is trailing in the race. The game earned \$12.7 million over its first week, which is only good for third place behind Fire Emblem Heroes' \$28.2 million, and Super Mario Run's \$16.1 million. It should be noted, though, that Fire Emblem Heroes is a free-to-play game with microtransactions, while Super Mario Run's full game is behind a paywall. Mario Kart Tour, meanwhile, offers a free two-week trial for its Gold Pass, which unlocks the fastest racing tier for \$5 per month. This means that the revenue is expected to start flowing in after the initial trial periods end. It remains to be seen if Mario Kart Tour will eventually exceed the success of Pokémon Go, which is not a Nintendo mobile game but uses characters from the popular Pokémon series. Pokémon Go was only downloaded 38.5 million times in its first week, but primarily because it had a limited release and only launched in three countries. The game has earned \$2.95 billion globally since it was released though, and \$110 million just last August alone, so Mario Kart Tour has a long way to go in terms of earnings. Editors' Recommendations Mario Kart Tour, the recently released free-to-play mobile version of the racing series, broke records for Nintendo, with launch day downloads surpassing even that of worldwide phenomenon Pokémon Go. Sensor Tower's Store Intelligence, meanwhile, places the racing app's launch day downloads at more than 20 million, nearly triple that of Super Mario Run's 7.0 million downloads when it launched for the figures of Apptopia and Sensor Tower, the shared conclusion is that Mario Kart Tour is Nintendo's biggest launch on mobile so far, sending blue shells into the competition. Apptopia said that "marketing, pre-orders, and IP" were the driving forces behind Mario Kart Tour's launch day success. The title was highly promoted in the app stores, and users who pre-ordered it with automatic downloads activated were ready to play almost as soon as the game was released. Of course, not to be discounted is the fact that Mario Kart is among Nintendo's most popular franchises, with the last installment released more than two years ago – Mario Kart 8 Deluxe for the Nintendo Switch, which is an upgraded version of the original title for the Nintendo Wii U. Mario Kart Tour, however, only ranked third among Nintendo's mobile games in terms of launch day revenue, according to Sensor Tower. The racing app earned about \$1 million in its first 24 hours, compared to \$4.3 million for Fire Emblem Heroes and about \$4 million for Super Mario Run. The slower start for Mario Kart Tour's revenue may be attributed to the game's monetization structure. In addition to in-app purchases for characters, karts, and loot boxes, players may also subscribe to a Gold Pass for \$5 per month. The Gold Pass unlocks extra gifts for racing in tours special badges from completing challenges, and most importantly, the 200cc tier, which is the fastest that the game's most popular in-app purchase, according to Sensor Tower, but the subscription revenue will only start flowing in after the trial period.
