## Different sexualities list

Romantic Orientation Those who are romantically attracted to the meaning they want to be in a romantic relationship with and are not related to sexual attraction. Sexual orientation Those who are sexually attracted to the meaning that you get lit by or who want to engage in sexual behavior with.\*note all listed below are also applicable to romantic orientations. These take the prefix of the word and the final -romantic, that is heteroromantic, panromantic, aromantic. Heterosexual The attraction of a genus other than them (commonly used to describe someone who is binary of [female or male] attracted by the other binary genre). Homosexuals... The attraction of a genre the same as its own (commonly used to describe someone who is binary of the genus [female or male] attracted by the same binary sex). Sometimes it's called gay. Lesbians Women who are attracted only by other women Bisexual- When you're attracted to two or more genres. This term is generally used to describe being attracted to men and women, but can apply to be attracted to any two or more genres. Note that it is not necessary to be equally attracted by any kind. Pansexual When you are attracted to all kinds and/or don't worry about sex when you are attracted to someone Bicurious. People who are open to experiment with genres that are not just them, but do not know if they are open to form any kind of relationship with multiple genres. Polisexual When you are attracted by many generaMonosexual- Being attracted to one sexAllosexual- When you are not asexual (attracted to at least one sex)Androsexual- Be attracted to male gender presentationGynosexual- Being attracted to female gender presentationQuestioning- People who are discussing their sexuality/genderAsexual- Not living sexual attraction (note that you can also be aromantic and not must be asexual and aromantic at the same time). Sometimes the term, ace, is to describe the asexuals. Demisexual... When you experience only sexual attraction after the formation of a strong emotional bond before or a romantic bondGrey Asexual- When you experience only attraction rarely, on a very low scale, or only in certain circumstances Perioriented When your sexual and romantic orientation addresses the same genre (for example being heteroromantic and heterosexual or biromantic and bisexual)Varioriented- When your sexual and romantic orientations do not turn to the same set of genres (for example being heteroromantic and bisexual or being homogenous and pansexual)Heteronormative- The belief that etherealism is the norm and that sex, sex, sexuality and gender roles all alignErasure- Ignoring the existence of genders and sexuality in the middle of the spectrumCishe- Someone who is both cysgendered and heterosexual. Sometimes this is used as a sleigh. Poliamoroso An umbrella term that refers to people who have or are open to have consciously relationships with more people at the same timeMonoamorous- People who have or are open to have relationships with one person at a time. The term, monogamous, is sometimes used. Queer- An appeal for anyone in the LGBT+ community or who does not identify himself as cisgender and/or heterosexual/heterosexual Ally- A supporter of the LGBT+ community who does not identify itself as LGBT+ Sex... Your gender assigned to birth and/or the genus of your reproductive organsGender- Where it feels that you personally fall on the spectrum between male and female. Commonly people identify themselves as male or female, but some fall into the middle or move during the spectrum. - Cisgender. When you identify with the sex you were assigned to the birthTransgender- When you identify with a genre other than what you were assigned to the Transsexual birth When you had the Surgeryby Genre (GRS) to change the sexual organs with which you were born to that of a different genre.\*note that sometimes you will see after trans\*) which is intended to include both transgendered individuals and male transsexual to female (mtf) when someone who is assigned as a male to birth identifies itself as a malefemale to male (ftm-) when someone who is assigned as a female to birth identifies itself as a malebinary- genera to every end of the gender spectrum (male and female) Non-Binary- a term umbrella for genders that fall this can be used as a gender identification without further explanation. Sometimes the term, genderqueer, is oato. genderfluid- move between genders or have a floating gender identity- do not identify with any kind. sometimes referred to as being genderless or gendervoidbigender- identifying as two genera, commonly (but not exclusively) male and female. Sometimes you feel like both genres at the same time and sometimes it floats. polygender- when identifying with multiple genera at once. sometimes called multigender. neutrois- when identifying as age, male or female, and/or without apathetic gender- when you really do not identify or care for any particular kind. You're okay passing like anything and you really don't have an opinion towards your kind. Androgyn- This term overlaps a lot between gender identification and presentation. can be oato to describe others and as identification. This term is oato to describe people who are neither male nor female or are both male and female. basically anyone who does not fit into a category of binary genre. intergender- someone who is the genre is somewhere between male and femaledemigender- when you feel like you're a defined part and one or more parts a undefined genre. terms may include demigirl, demiboy,ect. Greygender- Someone with a weak gender identification of themselves Aporagender- Someone with a strong sexof themselves that is not maverique. a non-binary genus that exists outside the orthodox social limits of the genusnovigender- a genus that is super complex and impossible to describe in a single term designated genre- a sex assigned to birth based on a sex of individuals and/or that the society of gender percieves a person to beafab- assigned female to birthamab- assigned male to birthgender roles- the genus that you introduce to others. this is sometimes referred to as expression of gendertransitioning- the process of using medical means to change your sexintersex- a biological difference in sex which is when people are born with genitals, gonads, and/or chromosomes that do not correspond exactly with male or female. intersex individuals may have any romantic/sexual orientation and may have any gender identification. intersex individuals are common as red. dyadic- someone who is not intersex and when their genitals, gonads and chromosomes can all match in a male or female trans woman category. someone who is assigned as a male at birth, but identifies as a womantrans man- someone who is assigned as a female at birth, but identifies as a female trans-personal-person who identifies as a female, but identifies as neither a man nor a woman. must also be assigned to the male at birth. trans masculine someone who identifies himself as a male, but does not identify himself as neither man nor woman. women must also be assigned to birth. social dysphoria-safe experienced when you behave in socially different ways from your gender or be faced in different ways from your gender body dysphoria- comfortable experienced due to the difference between gender and gender, role, or gender expression butch- a term oato to describe someone who is gender expression is more male than female. This is used in the description of women or lesbians. Female (Fem)- A term used to describe someone who is gender expression is more feminine than male. This is commonly used in the description of women or lesbians. Binarism... Put the genus into two categories (male and female) and refuse to recognize the genera outside the male and female. Female.
